

# Railway Square goes PREPAY

From Monday 6 April 2009, weekdays 7am - 7pm

You must buy your ticket before you board the bus at these stops.

From Monday 6 April 2009, weekdays 7am - 7pm

- Sydney Buses services departing Railway Square will not sell tickets on board the bus between 7am and 7pm weekdays.
- You must buy your ticket before you travel.
- PrePay multi-ride tickets can save you 20% or more compared to single ride tickets.
- PrePay allows faster passenger boarding at bus stops improving the reliability of bus services.
- Ticket options, destinations, a section and fare guide, and ticket outlets are listed inside this brochure.

## PrePay and Save!

- Prepaid bus tickets can be used on all Sydney Buses regular services.
- PrePay multi-ride tickets can save you 20% or more compared to single ride tickets.

**Hint:** A 1-2 section Blue TravelTen can be used for longer bus trips by dipping the ticket multiple times. Just ask the driver how many dips are required. This is not the cheapest option but may be a convenient option if you travel infrequently.

### PrePay tickets include:

#### TravelTen



- Ticket with 10 rides – saves 20% compared to single ride tickets.
- Can be kept indefinitely – expires only after all 10 rides have been used.
- Can be used to pay for a companion – just dip your ticket the number of times required for the trip, for each person travelling.
- Different types are available depending on the number of sections travelled.
- Concession TravelTens are available only to holders of a student card or NSW Transport Concession Card featuring a transport foil.

### TravelPass (Weeklies)

- Ideal for trips that require frequent travel by train, bus or ferry or a combination of these transport modes.
- Unlimited travel\* (including transfers) over seven consecutive days on Sydney Buses, CityRail and Sydney Ferries regular services within the zones covered by the ticket.
- Different types are available depending on zones covered and the modes of transport used – bus, train and ferry or bus and ferry.

### Quarterly and Yearly TravelPasses

- If you work or study and use public transport regularly, you can save more money by buying a Quarterly TravelPass (13 weeks travel for the price of 11) or a Yearly TravelPass (52 weeks travel for the price of 40).
- These TravelPasses are by application only. For details visit [www.131500.com.au](http://www.131500.com.au) or phone Transport Info on 131500.
- Quarterly and Yearly TravelPasses will feature the customer's name and are for use by the customer only.
- Lost or damaged passes can be replaced for a fee.

### Single Ride Ticket



- Prepaid single ride tickets are available for one off trips.
- If you are planning a return trip, buy two single tickets or consider using a TravelTen. Remember TravelTen tickets save 20%, can be used to pay for an accompanying friend and do not expire until all ten rides are used.

**Hint:** Keep some single ride tickets in the office for business trips. 1-2 section tickets are valid for all trips within the CBD.

### Pensioner Excursion Ticket (PET)



- Unlimited all day travel\* on Sydney Buses, Newcastle Buses and Ferries, Sydney Ferries, CityRail and participating private buses around Sydney, Newcastle and outer metropolitan areas.
- Only holders of valid pensioner senior concession/authority cards can use this ticket.
- Prepaid PETs are sold at ticket outlets or TransitShops in the City.
- Prepaid PETs can be purchased well ahead of travel, becoming active on the day of use - except tickets purchased from CityRail ticket offices which are active from the day of purchase.

**\*Note:** Excludes travel on Explorer buses, ferry cruises, special event, charter or private buses. A separate station access fee is payable for all travel to stations on the Airport line including International, Domestic, Mascot and Green Square.

## Where to buy your ticket

### Ticket outlets

- TransitShops are run by Sydney Buses and offer the full range of bus tickets.
- Ticket outlets are independently run businesses and have their own trading practices including imposing a surcharge on EFTPOS or credit purchases.
- Ticket availability at these outlets depends on local demand and the order-delivery schedule based on the ticket outlet's location.
- Around 900 independent ticket outlets are available throughout Sydney for your convenience (look for the purple flag and PrePay signs). You will need to select your ticket before visiting these stores. ### CityRail ticket offices

Most CityRail ticket offices sell TravelTens and weekly TravelPasses valid on Sydney Buses services. Pensioner Excursion Tickets and Weekly TravelPasses sold at CityRail ticket offices are active from the day of purchase.

### TransitShops

All Sydney Buses tickets can be purchased at any of the four Sydney Buses TransitShops located in the City at:

- Circular Quay – cnr Loftus and Alfred Streets: Mon-Fri 7am-7pm; Sat-Sun 8.30am-5pm
- Wynyard Station – Carrington Street entrance; Mon-Fri 7am-7pm
- QVB – York Street near bus stand C; Mon-Fri 7am-7pm (From 6 April, 2009)
- Railway Square – cnr George and Lee Streets: Mon-Fri 7am-7pm (From 6 April, 2009)

## The PrePay network

There are currently 42 routes and 25 bus stops that are PrePay-only across the Sydney Buses network.

Bus stops at Wynyard are the most recent additions to the PrePay network, operating PrePay-only services from bus stops in Carrington, York and Clarence Streets from 7am to 7pm, weekdays. The conversion of Wynyard was the first step in the rollout of PrePay-only across the CBD with the remainder of the CBD to be PrePay-only by the middle of the year.

## Use the right ticket

- Revenue Protection Officers travel on Sydney Buses frequently.
- On the spot fine of up to \$100 or a court-imposed fine of up to \$550 applies for not having a ticket, using the wrong ticket, over-riding or using a concession ticket without a valid concession or authority card.

## Take care of your ticket

- Except for faulty tickets, Sydney Buses does not replace damaged (folded, torn) tickets.
- CityRail issued tickets are active from the date purchased. Tickets issued from other outlets only become active when first used. If you have purchased multiple tickets please keep the unused tickets separate from the ones you are using to avoid confusion.
- Please take note when using your Pensioner Excursion Ticket on CityRail services because the validity date is not printed on the back when inserted in the station's automatic gates.
- TravelTen tickets are active until all ten rides have been used.

Please dip your ticket in the green ticket machine each time you board the bus.

## Lost property

Keep your bus ticket for a record of the bus route, time and direction of your travel. This will help track your lost property item. Please phone 131500 for any lost property enquiry.

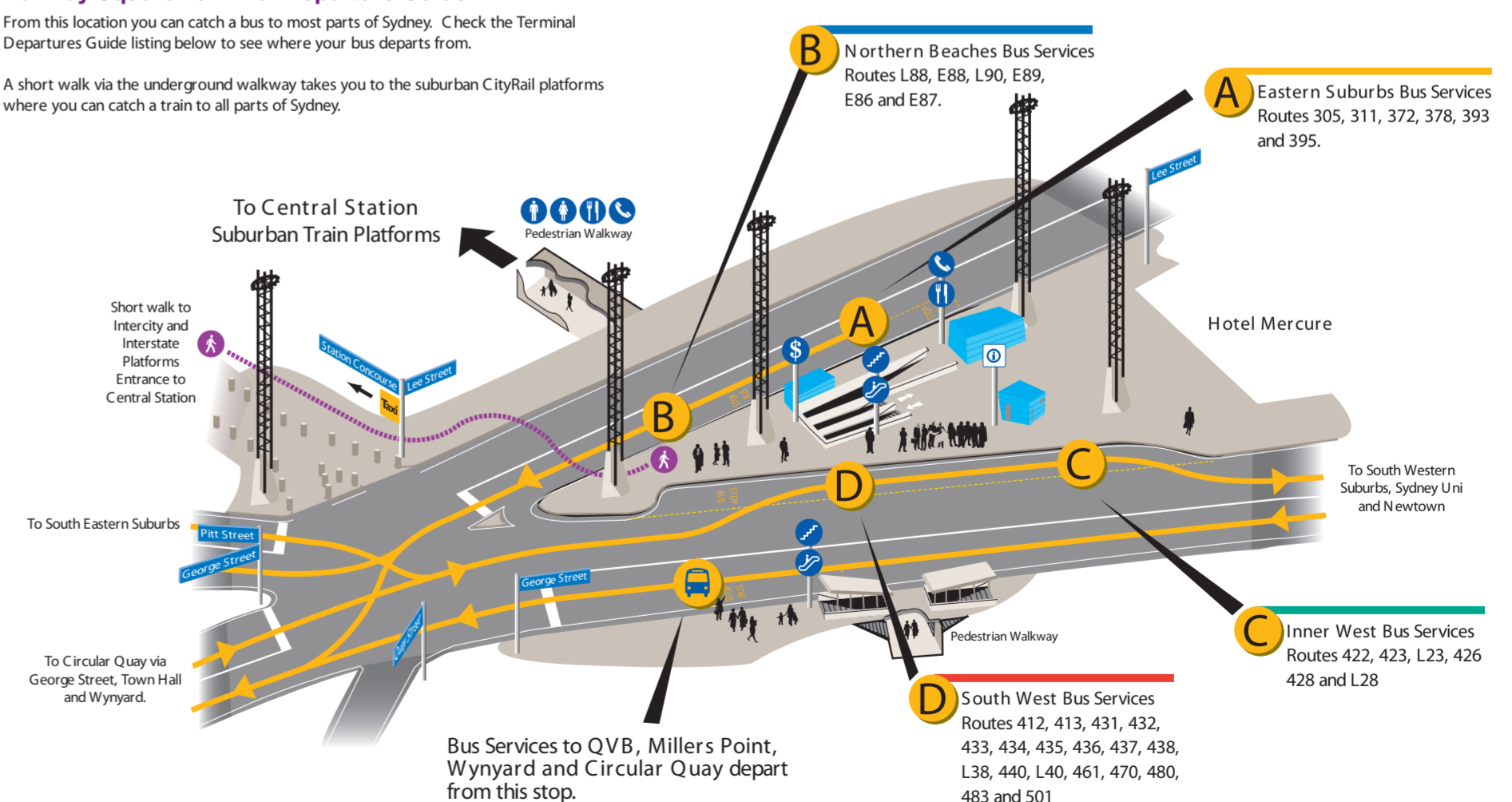
